here with all the rich heritage locally. Often spotted on the beach - do go and say hello if you spot her!




RICHARD BAKER - TRUSTEE

CHRISTINE LINK - TRUSTEE

Christine has been involved in the local community through worshipping in the Havens Beacon Churches, including at St Madoc of Ferns until its

closure in 2022. She finds Haroldston West Church a little gem, which should not be taken away from the Havens Community. She joined StMoFCG as a trustee to help to secure a new life for this lovely building.

The trustees have been working towards several immediate goals.

Firstly, we needed to raise some short-term funds for surveyors and architectural specialists to advise us on the state of the building. Thanks to work by Alison Gibby, we have gained significant financial and intellectual support and now have a good idea of the structural challenges – damp, subsidence and a dodgy bell tower – which face us.

Secondly, we need to negotiate a long-term lease with the Church in Wales. They have requested a business plan. Thanks to Nicky Morton, we have produced a three-year business plan which identified probable sources of income. We will use local solicitors to help us negotiate the lease.

Finally, and most importantly, we have to show that we have community support for all our plans. On 14th September, we launched a membership drive and signed up a number of members. Being a member will assure participation in Annual General Meetings and the receipt of newsletters. Obtaining local support is essential, as it makes getting grants easier if we can show we are meeting a community need.

Over the summer, we have not been idle......

In June, pilgrims led by St David's Cathedral Pilgrim Officer Janet Ingram visited St Madoc's,

walking up through Haroldston woods from Broad Haven. We also held a fundraising coffee morning with live music in Bowen Memorial Hall and, to complete a busy month, Juliet Heslewood gave a lecture on art in churches, at St David's Oriel y Parc.

In July, the group received a £5,000 grant from the Benefact Trust via the Plunkett Foundation for feasibility works noted above.

In August, we held a cheese and wine quiz evening and, in September, we featured in the CADW Open Doors weekend, which featured a guided walk up the Woodland Way to St Madoc's, where people were shown around the Mediaeval and Victorian church.

Throughout the recent months, we have held several committee meetings and have become familiar with Zoom! In the coming months, we will hopefully conclude lease negotiations.
